

KILLINGHOLME FULL BORE CLUB.

CLUB RULES.

The Killingholme Full Bore Club is a private club. Who is permitted to shoot, how, and what firearms can be used are restricted.

Who Can Shoot.

- Full members with Firearm Certificates are permitted to shoot unaccompanied.
- Probationary members, cadets and guests are only permitted to attend and shoot when accompanied by specified, full members in possession of a Firearm Certificate.
- Persons over the age of eighteen with no criminal record, (nor Cautions) with an interest in target shooting are welcome to attend by appointment, as a guest and will be hosted by a member of the committee. Those wishing to pursue the sport MUST on their second visit bring with them a completed application form, with references and passport photo. Until this is returned they will NOT be able to shoot.
- In view of the demands of the Child Protection act persons under the age of eighteen are not permitted to attend the club.

Firearms.

- Firearms are not to be taken into the club house.
- Firearms are to remain covered or cased until at the firing point, and covered or cased for return to cars.
- Any shooter unaccompanied MUST sign in as RCO. When there are two or more shooters an RCO MUST be appointed and sign for this responsibility in the Range Log.
- Shooters and hosts only are permitted at the firing points. It is not a place for conversation nor a viewing gallery.

- When a shooter, or squad, is finished shooting the firing point must be cleared and tided and targets removed for the next shooters. Before leaving the range the last shooters are expected to rake the backstop sand.

Conduct

- All attendees to the club are expected to behave safely and responsibly.
- Alcohol is not permitted on club grounds.
- Members hosting probationary members must complete all documentation and pass payment for attendance to the Treasurer.

Club House.

- No single person is responsible for tidiness of the club House. Members are expected to keep the Club House tidy and remove waste.
